CHAPTER 11-4 SPEED RESTRICTIONS

11-4-1 RESTRICTIONS AS TO SPEED

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a motor vehicle on a street or highway located within the corporate limits of the City at a speed greater than is reasonable or prudent under the conditions then existing or at speeds in excess of those fixed by this chapter or statutes of the state relevant to motor vehicle speed regulations or provided by the department of transportation. 1926 R.O. §104; 1960 PLO. §9.0401; Ordinance 188, 4/5/82; Authority: SDCL 9-31-3; Compare SDCL Ch. 32-35

11-4-2 SPEED LIMITATIONS

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a motor vehicle on a state highway located within the corporate limits of the City at speeds in excess of or greater than those fixed by the statutes of the State of South Dakota relevant to motor vehicle speed regulations or provided by the Department of Transportation.
- (b) Other than state highways as set out in the preceding subsection, it shall be unlawful to exceed any of the following speed limitations on public streets and alleys as the same are located and platted within the corporate limits of the City, to-wit:
 - 1. Twenty miles an hour in any business district as defined in Section 11-1-1, and Main Street between Seventh Street and the South City Limits.
 - 2. Fifteen miles an hour when passing public parks, schools or school grounds during recess or while children are going to or leaving school during opening or closing hours.
 - 3. Twenty miles an hour in all other areas of town not specifically addressed above.
- (c) Appropriate signs indicating the maximum speed permissible shall be placed at reasonable intervals in each of the said restrictive zones.
